

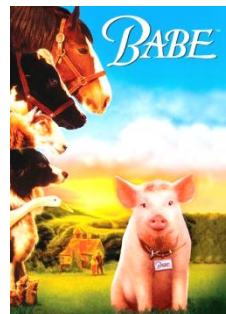
# Family Track

*freespirited Maria brings music, warmth, and love to a regimented Austrian household at the brink of WW II*

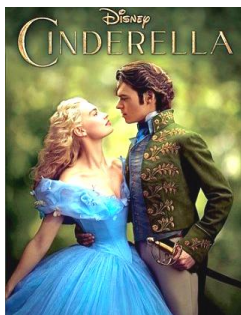


**November 4**

*a swashbuckling historical drama set on the high seas of the Napoleonic wars*

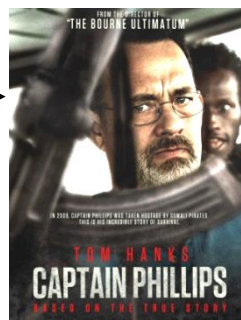


**December 2**

**June 2**

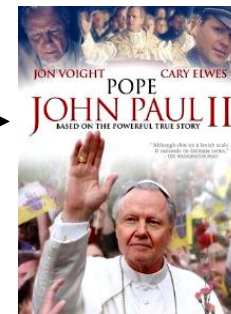
*Chilean miners struggle to survive 69 days trapped underground in 2010.*

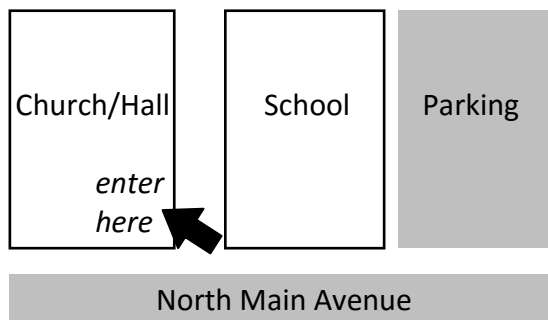
